Discussion Questions

Date: April 5, 2020 | Scripture: <u>Luke 19:28-44</u>

- 1. Read <u>Luke 19:28-44</u>. What stands out to you?
- 2. The drama of the Bible can be broken down into four parts: creation, fall, redemption, and restoration. How do these four headings help us make sense of the Bible, Jesus' life and ministry, and our world today?
- 3. Jesus made his entry into Jerusalem on a donkey, even as storm clouds were gathering around him. What does Jesus' triumphal entry teach us about his sovereignty and control over history?
- 4. When rebuked by the religious leaders, Jesus said that if the people didn't praise him, the very stones would cry out. Have you recently been in awe of creation? What was that experience like, and what did it teach you about God?
- 5. When Jesus came to Jerusalem, he wept over it. What does Jesus' weeping over the city teach us about him? How do the tears of our Savior give us comfort in these difficult times?
- 6. As Easter approaches, what are some ways we can prepare our hearts to receive the good news of Christ's victory over sin and death? Who in your life needs to hear it this Easter, and how can you reach out to them?
