

Sermon Questions: Grace-Filled Identity

Date: August 1, 2021 | Scripture: Ephesians 6:5-9

- 1. Read Ephesians 6:5-9. What are your initial reactions to the text? Does it feel familiar? Foreign? Offensive? Helpful? Insensitive?
- 2. Pastor Nathan implored us to take stock of our own context as we approach this passage. What in your context makes this passage hard or strange to approach?
- 3. Most commentators apply the principles from this passage to the workplace today. Describe a time you've seen authority abused in the workplace or, on the flipside, a poor employee.
- 4. Spend some time discussing in which areas of life you are in a position of authority and which areas of life you are in a position of submission or subordination. What principles do you keep consistent?
- 5. How does not being a people-pleaser but being a servant of Christ protect against temptations for those in positions of subordination?
- 6. How does treating everyone as an image-bearer protect against the temptations for those in positions of authority?
