

Sermon Questions

Date: *January 9, 2021* | Scripture: <u>1 Peter 1:1-12</u>

- 1. Verse 6 reminds us that God knows we face trials. In verses 1-5 Peter emphasizes certain actions of God that shape the believer's experience of suffering. Looking at 1-5,
 - a. What has God done?
 - b. What is God doing?
- 2. Verses 6 reveals the contrasting experiences Christians face throughout life. How do verses 7-9 reconcile this joy and suffering? What, according to verse 8, is central to this paradoxical experience?
- 3. Verses 10-12 seem less immediate to the situation of believers enduring trials. Why has Peter included this thought?
- 4. 'There will always be something in your life dominating and disrupting your life. You need reasons for hope.' How can the life, death and resurrection of Christ give you hope in trials you are facing now?
- 5. Look at the question below from the Westminster Shorter Catechism. What, according to this, is the hope that Peter says will never perish, spoil or fade? What do you make of it?

Westminster Shorter Catechism

Q. 38. What benefits do believers receive from Christ at the resurrection?

A. At the resurrection, believers being raised up in glory [a], shall be openly acknowledged and acquitted in the day of judgment [b], and made perfectly blessed in the full enjoying of God [c] to all eternity [d].

- [a]. I Cor. 15:42-43
- [b]. Matt. 25:33-34, 46
- [c]. Rom. 8:29; 1 John 3:2
- [d]. Ps. 16:11; 1 Thess. 4:17
