



Sermon Questions

Date: *March 13, 2022* | Scripture: *Psalm 117*

1. Read Psalm 117. Why do you think such a short Psalm was included in the Bible?
2. Talk about the attributes of the Lord that are described in this Psalm. What is He like?
3. In the book of Genesis, God repeats his promise to bless all nations through his people five times, at key points. What does it look like when we begin to believe that God's grace is just for us?
4. Those who get grace deeply extend grace generously. Where have you seen this work out?
5. 'I will go wherever, do whatever, give whatever you want me to.' Consider what it would mean to pray this prayer. What would keep you from praying it? What would lead you to pray it? What might it look like to pursue answers to this prayer?

Where is a candle more effective—in a room filled with light, or a room filled with darkness? Even though there are millions of unsaved people in this country, America has light. We have the Good News! But in much of the rest of the world, there are millions of people who have not heard the Word a single time. There is much darkness. So where should I spend my time?
