

Sermon Questions

Date: *April 24, 2022* | Scripture: <u>1 Corinthians 15:1-11</u>

- 1. Read 1 Corinthians 15:1-11. What is 'of first importance' according to Paul?
- 2. The resurrection is central to Jesus' work for us (justification) and Jesus' work in us (sanctification). How does this help us work through the idea that we are being saved (v2) even while v3 reminds us that our sins have already been dealt with?
- 3. If Jesus rose form the dead and is alive, what does that mean for our confidence and identity as Christians?
- 4. How would you respond to a friend who is not a Christian if they said they do not believe in the resurrection? Discuss this as a group.
- 5. What are some practical steps we can take towards growing in our understanding of the resurrection?
 - a. Consider reading through 1 Corinthians 15 slowly in daily quiet times
 - Consider reading through Sam Allberry's book <u>Lifted</u> or Tim Keller's book <u>Hope in Times of Fear</u> individually or as a group

For Reflection...

"From the beginning the resurrection of Christ was an enormously important constituent of the faith of the church: without that faith it would never have started. For all the disciples had been offended by the cross. When Jesus was taken prisoner and killed, they had fled (Mark 14:50) and gone into hiding. But their faith revived when they learned that Jesus had risen. They now reconsidered the earlier life of Jesus in the light of the resurrection: how he had
