

## Sermon Questions

Date: April 3, 2022 | Scripture: <u>John 11</u>

- 1. Read John 11:20-44. How does Jesus respond to different people in this story?
- 2. Re-read 11:25-26. What does this mean? And what are the implications for us?
- 3. Consider these two accounts of what happened to Lazarus as Jesus raised him from the grave. How do they help us understand the Christian's hope in the face of death?
  - I. "Lazarus emerges from the tomb, and the first thing he sees is the tear-stained face of God, and the funeral becomes a homecoming."
  - II. "Lazarus heard the voice of his Lord in eternity, and he obeyed. Lazarus listened to his King, and he re-entered the land of the living by the power of the Word of GOD, Jesus Christ."
- 4. In Christ we have hope, and yet with Christ we weep. Take a moment together to acknowledge the pain and damage of death, and our need for Christ in the face of it.
- 5. Take some time to discuss other points from the sermon, or questions that have arisen from your time together.

## Inward Grace in Action

The questions below are a little more intimate and are meant to be discussed with a trusted friend or partner.

- 6. Grief is not a brief process. Name those you have lost, and the pain it has caused, and share the burden together before Christ.
- 7. Death is not the end for anybody. What does this mean for you, and the challenges ahead?
