Date: *July 23, 2023* | Scripture: *Psalm 6*3

- 1. Read the passage from the sermon together. What do you find convicting? What do you find challenging? What do you find confusing?
- 2. This psalm is full of imagery. What imagery stands out most to you?
- 3. Have you ever gone through a season where you believe in God but don't really feel him? What was that like?
- 4. Have you ever had an experience where God felt incredibly near and real and powerful? What was that like?
- 5. Who or what in your life helps you feel reconnected to God? What has God given us to regularly connect with him?
- 6. How has God protected you from enemies?
- 7. How was this psalm sung by Jesus? How can we sing this psalm about Jesus?

Inward Grace in Action (continued on the back)

In Ryan's sermon at McLean this week he gave an illustration from the life of seventeenth-century French philosopher and theologian Blaise Pascal. He had become a Christian late in his life, and after his death a small patch was discovered on the inside of his coat. Stitched right above his heart, it retold of a significant encounter he had with God one night—so significant, he wanted a physical reminder of it on himself wherever he went. The full text of that patch is included below.

- What do you make of Pascal's patch? What stands out to you about it?
- When have you felt about God as Pascal did? How did you express that feeling?

ACTION: What is your version of Pascal's patch sewn in his coat? Do you have a physical reminder of a significant encounter with God in your life? If not, take some time this week to make or buy one. It could be a framed picture of the place you had that experience, or a rock or knickknack to keep on your desk that reminds you of it, or a watch or piece of jewelry you can wear as a reminder. Use it as a token that whenever you see or remember it you say a short word of prayer to God "Thank you for meeting me at that time, Lord, and for being with me now."
