## Core Questions

- 1. "In a perfect world, I would not have to work." Discuss, with reference to Genesis 1:28, 2:15, 3:17-19, and others.

- 3. Where in your work are you bringing order out of chaos, or drawing out the flourishing of others?

## Inward Grace in Action

4. Many of us make idols (when we make a good thing an ultimate thing) of work, whether a current role, a past role, or a hoped-for future role. This can manifest in bitter regret over past choices, workaholism, or deep discontent in your present calling. Where is this true in you? How can knowing Christ lift this burden?

### Outward Grace in Action

- 5. The body of Christ (all the diverse members of the church) is called to many different vocations. How can you encourage each other in your CGs in pursuing their vocation for God's glory?
- 6. What would it take to flourish in the work you do now as an act of love, overflowing from how you have been loved? Ask for and offer support to one another.
