Core Questions

1. What does Jesus mean by 'daily bread'?

Inward Grace in Action

5. There is often a perceived tension for Christians between depending on God's provision and working hard to use the gifts he has given to provide for one another. Look at the Deuteronomy, Matthew and James verses in the sidebar. Where does your heart most struggle to believe?

Outward Grace in Action

6. The world offers bleak, stigmatized pictures of neediness, and denies that God actively provides. How does the promise of daily bread communicate the character of God and the wonder of the gospel to lost people?
