Core Questions

1. How does the immediate context of verse 24 affect how we read this passage?
2. Jesus calls us to leave anxiety about god's provision in favor of seeking first the kingdom of God and his righteousness. What does this mean? In what ways is it kind?
3. How are the illustrations of birds and flowers relevant to us, and what do they tell us about how God regards us?

Inward Grace in Action

4. When things are not ok, and there is no prospect that they will be ok, where do you turn? How have you found your way to Christ in these times?

Outward Grace in Action

5. Jesus offers what no one else can: hope beyond the worst things, even death, and meaning now. We can sometimes be embarrassed to share the gospel with people who have known deep suffering. How could your honest testimony of how he has 'added' to you in hard times play into these conversations?
