Founded in 1992 by church member Ed Bradley, Oakseed assists indigenous ministries that bring the gospel to abandoned children and the poor in the mega-cities of the developing world. Currently, the organization supports 25 indigenous ministries worldwide through prayer, funding, counsel, and training; these ministries impact approximately 300,000 people each week.
