September 29, 2024 | Scripture: 1 Thessalonians 2:17-3:13 (Faith)

- 1. If Timothy were sent to inspect our church today, what would his report be on the state of our faith? How are we, as individuals and as a community, "standing fast in the Lord"?

- 3. Paul emphasizes the Thessalonians' spiritual well-being as his top concern. What are the priorities in your life right now? How might they shift if you were to place faith in Jesus at the center of your concerns?
- 4. Paul's emotional connection to the Thessalonians is evident in his letter. How comfortable are we with being emotionally vulnerable and expressive in our love for fellow believers? How might this deepen our relationships in the church?
