## Core Questions

1. The Israelites' fear and lack of trust in God in verses 10-12 reveal a natural inclination to doubt when faced with danger. How do you relate to their complaining and doubt? How can we better understand our own propensity for unbelief and yet trust in God's sovereign grace to preserve us?
2. As a group read Psalm 77 and discuss how it speaks to our suffering and God's deliverance. How did remembrance of the Red Sea become a rally cry for God's people in the Old Testament?
3. God's miraculous deliverance through the parting of the Red Sea (Exodus 14:21-22) is a clear display of His power. How does this event point to the gospel of Jesus Christ, especially as we understand the "greater exodus" that Jesus accomplished through His death and resurrection?
