Core Questions

1. In Exodus 19:4, God reminds Israel of how He rescued them from Egypt before giving them the law. Why does he do this? What does this teach us about the relationship between God's grace and our obedience?
2. In 24:7-9, we see blood sprinkled on the altar and on the people. What is the significance of blood in covenants? How does this highlight the costliness of Christ shedding his own blood?
3. In 24:9-11, Moses and the elders eat and drink in God's presence. What does this teach us about the role of fellowship in our covenant relationship with God and each other?

Inward Grace in Action

4. We live as if "we must do good, to get good things", how does God's grace correct that in our hearts? What then becomes our motivation to live righteously?

Outward Grace in Action

5. Many non-Christians see Christianity as "just a set of rules", how can we proclaim that God is not a "divine taskmaster" but as the one who is gracious and frees us from slavery.
