## WORSHIP THROUGHOUT THE WEEK

### Core Questions

1. What difference does it make that God is eternal trinity, and eternally in joyful relationship in his persons, not solitary?
2. “Other Gods choke out the fulness of life and recreate us in their image.” Why do we persistently choose false gods, when the true God has made himself known? Think scripturally and personally.
3. How are we as a church particularly tempted to go after other Gods? Consider especially Deuteronomy 8.

4. What stays the same about you in different situations through life? Has God become your center of gravity, or do other things come before him?
5. Read the catechism question below. It gives a sweeping application of the First Commandment. Choose one or two to prayerfully devote yourself to growth in, and share it with a partner in the CG.

### Outward Grace in Action

6. “God demands everything of you, because he has given everything to you.” How would you respond to someone who feels God’s demand of exclusive worship is selfish?

WLC Q. 104. What are the duties required in the first commandment?

Answer: The duties required in the first commandment are, the knowing and acknowledging of God to be the only true God, and our God; and to worship and glorify him accordingly, by thinking, meditating, remembering, highly esteeming, honoring, adoring, choosing, loving, desiring, fearing of him; believing him; trusting, hoping, delighting, rejoicing in him; being zealous for him; calling upon him, giving all praise and thanks, and yielding all obedience and submission to him with the whole man; being careful in all things to please him, and sorrowful when in anything he is offended; and walking humbly with him.
