- 1. Read Exodus 20:4–6. What stands out to you in how God frames this commandment—particularly the reason he gives for it? How does understanding God's jealousy as covenantal love help us see the goodness of this command?
- 2. We often create mental images or manageable conceptions of God, even without physical idols. Have you ever caught yourself saying or thinking, "I like to think of God as..."? Where do you think your mental picture of God comes from—and how has Scripture corrected or reshaped that image?
- 3. The second commandment echoes the truth that God has already given us his image—in humanity and most fully in Christ. How does seeing Jesus as "the image of the invisible God" (Colossians 1:15) shape your desire to know and worship God rightly?
