### Core Questions

- 1. How does the passage help us understand what it would have been like to be a leper in Jesus's day?
- 2. Why does Jesus tell the lepers to show themselves to the priests instead of healing them right away?
- 3. How does Jesus's disappointment that only one of the lepers returned to give thanks to God reveal the deeper sickness that he wants to heal in this passage?

## Inward Grace in Action

- 1. When is it difficult for you to be "the needy one" in your family, church, or friend group?
- 2. How does the grace of the gospel free us to cry out to God and his people in our need?

### Outward Grace in Action

1. How can you, as a family, community group, or individual, institute rhythms of gratitude into your life?

For Families: Ideas of how to keep the conversation going at home, in the car, or around the dinner table:

- A Ask about the message: Ask children to share one thing that they are thankful for that God has given them.
- 2. S Share your thoughts: Give examples of what you are thankful for in your own life as an adult.
- 3. K Keep it going: Set aside time to pray and thank the Lord for all the many gifts he has given your family.

Here are some other ways you can meet with God throughout the week:

Reflect on these Scriptures:

- 2 Kings 5:1-19
- Psalm 107
- Isaiah 35:5-6

Pray: We are most appreciative when we are most aware of our need for grace. Take time to read through Psalm 107. Then write down any ways that the Psalm reminds you of the ways that the Lord has redeemed you. Finally, take that list and pray a prayer of thanksgiving for the Lord's mercy in your life.

Serve: The Lord knows that we are a needy people. That is why he has placed us in a church family. If you are in need, take time to reach out to a church leader to make them aware of that this week. If you can serve, reach out to one person in the church this week to ask how you can care for them.
