October 5th, 2025 | Scripture: Mark 10:17-34 – Jesus Meets Us in Our Self-Righteousness

Core Questions

- 1. If this rich young man had his life together in the worldly sense, then why did he come up to Jesus in the first place?
- 2. How does Jesus's response to the man's question in verses 18-21 bankrupt his "do well, inherit well" framework?
- 3. Jesus doubles down on the dangers of trusting in riches in verses 23-27. What does his hyperbolic example about the camel teach about inheriting eternal life?
- 4. How does the broader context of Jesus' going to the cross in Jerusalem, pointed out in verses 32-34, reveal Jesus's heart for those stuck in self-righteousness?

Inward Grace in Action

1. How does living for an inheritance that we cannot lose bring security, purpose, and hope to our hearts?

Outward Grace in Action

1. How can you take one step closer to the body of Christ as active reception of your heavenly inheritance on earth?

For Families: Ideas of how to keep the conversation going at home, in the car, or around the dinner table:

- A Ask about the message: Encourage kids to share one thing they remember from the children's message or sermon in their own words.
- 2. S Share your thoughts: Share a time when Jesus met you in your self-righteousness as an adult.
- 3. K Keep it going: Take time to pray that Jesus would show your family more of the treasure you have in him.
